Youth Justice Reparation Supervisor

Supported by	Youth Justice Service Referral Order Co-ordinator
Role summary	Helping to supervise young offenders working on community-based projects, such as gardening, painting and graffiti removal. Indirect reparation projects are designed so that young offenders can make amends for the harm they have caused and assist with their reintegration back into the local community.

Tasks and responsibilities

You will be expected to:

- help supervise young offenders completing reparation projects
- support youth justice staff in the supervision of reparation duties
- act in an anti-discriminatory way in all aspects of service delivery
- participate in training and supervision
- adhere to any relevant Council policies and procedures – for example, health and safety

Skills and experience

You must:

- have excellent communication skills
- be reliable and have commitment
- have empathy with young people
- be able to maintain confidentiality

Time commitment

4-hour slots, usually outside of school and college hours.

We will:

- reimburse expenses, as agreed
- provide induction training
- provide on-going support and guidance
