Our Autism training is two tier. We have awareness training and then the Spell Framework delivered by the National Autistic Society. These have been accessed by Social workers and other frontline staff. Supplementary training called @Safer Living Tour' has also been undertaken by staff which was delivered by a person with Autism. We have a new Advocacy provider who actively promote volunteers, we will be supporting them to develop this area.

To provide access to a diagnostic assessment and intervention service for young people (18-30 years)

To provide access to an assessment for those over 30 years of age to assist in establishing a differential diagnosis.

To ensure that young people who do have AS have access to:group work particularly to address social functioning

Family therapy

Vocational support and employment opportunities

Individual work to address for e.g. anxiety, low mood

The Service is based in the Basildon Community Resource Centre but where possible individuals are offered appointments in other settings in their local areas as well as home visits also. As the Service develops further community bases may be utilised so as to provide services across the Trust area.

The Service is a two tier service, providing assessment; and where a diagnosis of Aspergers Syndrome, is made, access to a range of support including occupational therapy, family therapy and individual psychology services.

People over the age of 30 will be offered an assessment only, as the service develops this may be reconsidered.

Everyone in the above number have been allocated a personal budget within the process - this does not mean that this resulted in the individual being given a individual service fund or direct payment and some services are still Council commissioned. Whilst we have reported that 12 people have a diagnosis of Autism and a Learning Disability under the perameters of question 27, this is not reflective of the number of people with Autism that Thurrock Council work with.

All advocates who work with adults and children with learning disabilities and autism will have received training from The National Autistic Society and Brookdale (specialist Autistic Assessment Hospital). The training includes an understanding of the Adult Autism Strategy and of autistic spectrum disorders (ASD) as life-long conditions that affect how a person communicates with and relates to other people, and affects the way they view the world around them. Our advocates who work with young people with a learning disability, autism and/or mental health problems are experienced in youth work and know how to develop a rapport with young people. They come from a range of cultural backgrounds.

Our ULO Thurrock Centre for Independent Living (TCIL) whom we contract with to provide support with work skills and employment training to Learning Disabled people and people with Autism, called World of Work. They have made partnerships with the Disability Employment Advisors at the Job Centre and have received referrals. TCIL have also made links with the local large shopping centre and attended the job fair with a stall to promote the work and for people with a learning disability and autism to meet potential employers and discuss the possibility of paid work. TCIL also work in collaboration with other organisations and local schools regarding transition work.
