REGULATIONS FOR CREMATED REMAINS SECTION

Rules and Regulations in respect of Cemeteries

You are advised to read the above rules and regulations booklet give full details of the rules within the cemetery and the graves available, booklets are available from the Councils Cemetery Office burialcremations.admin@thurrock.gov.uk

Exclusive Right of Burial

The Exclusive Right of Burial is granted for a period of 40 years for a cremated remains grave.

Cremated Remains Graves

A cremated remains grave will hold up to four interments of cremated remains which must be interred in a biodegradable container unless the remains are to be scattered in a memorial garden.

Grays New Cemetery

The Cremated Remains Section is an area of lapsed graves, previously allocated for public graves. As no interments have taken place for many years and public graves are rarely required, Exclusive Rights of Burial for Cremated Remains are offered.

Cremated Remains Sections

The section is based on the lawn cemetery principle and each cremated remains grave measures three feet by four feet six inches and is laid in an avenue of level grass. If the registered owner so wishes, the grave may be marked by a memorial of a type and size as permitted within the cremated remains section of the cemetery.

Items not permitted under any circumstances

- Fences, edging stone, surrounds
- Grave or decorative chippings
- Planting of any kind
- Glass, porcelain, brittle plastics, fragile items
- Noisy items
- Balloons
- Toys or ornaments

Note:

The Council does not accept responsibility for damage or loss of any memorials, ornaments etc how ever caused. The Council has a responsibility to ensure the cemetery is free of obvious dangers and hazards. Example of hazards are glass, potter items the break, sharp objects, items placed in paths reducing the width of the path and items that are a tripping hazard. Such items will be removed with or without prior notification and will be available for collection from the office for a period of one month. In addition it may be necessary from time to time to remove items in the cemetery that cause a disturbance, (such as wind chimes) or offence to visitors attending the cemetery. Please help the Council to provide a safe cemetery, which is an attractive and peaceful place to visit. As a responsible grave owner you have your part to play.
