Application for the Interment of Ashes and Memorial Plaque

Thurrock Council have designated memorial gardens within cemeteries listed below where cremated remains can be scattered and memorial plaques are provided for a fixed term lease of 7 years that can be renewed. These are they only areas where cremated remains can be scattered. Cremated remains cannot be scattered on purchased graves.

- Chadwell St Mary Cemetery
- Corringham Cemetery
- North Stifford Cemetery

A small Perspex plaque, approximate 15cm (6ins) x 10cm (4ins), will be fixed to the wall/kerbing bordering the memorial area. The plaques can be inscribed with short epitaphs of approximately 56 characters and the following examples may be of assistance when completing the required inscription on the application form.
