FINANCIAL HELP



If you or someone you are supporting is struggling financially, there are funds and grants in place you can apply for.

The information below can help you find the best advice and support you need.

Essential Living Fund

The council's Essential Living Fund is here to help vulnerable people who might be struggling.

You can apply for the fund for:

- a bed, settee, wardrobe or table
- furnishings such as carpets, curtains or bedding
- · 'white goods' such as a cooker, fridge or washing machine
- · household equipment cooking utensils and small electrical appliances
- fuel connection or re-connection charges
- · clothing and footwear
- general living expenses groceries i.e. nappies, toiletries, cleaning or hygiene products, money for pay-as-you-go fuel meters

Discretionary Housing Payment

Discretionary Housing Payment (DHP) is an extra payment to help you pay your rent and other housing costs. It is not a benefit payment, but a separate payment on top of housing benefit.



Council Tax Support

Households on low income can get money off their council tax bills through Council Tax Support, including those who receive:

- income support
- job seeker's allowance
- employment support allowance
- pension credit

You can apply online. You do not need to have an account to apply. You will need to provide evidence documents, you will receive a list when you submit an online application.

You can also get help from the government, utility companies and other organisations.

Free mobile calls, texts and data

You may be able to benefit from this scheme - also known as 'data gifting' - if:

- you are at least 18 years-old
- you are a Thurrock resident
- you are receiving benefits or on low income
- · you can't afford your phone's monthly contract or top-up charges
- you have limited or no access to the internet in the UK, either at home or when away from home
- your mobile device is either 'unlocked' or compatible with a participating company's SIM card. Contact your mobile service provider or ask library staff if you're not sure.

HELP FOR PENSIONERS



Any residents who are above State Pension Age and are on a low income should apply for Pension Credit, which can unlock thousands of pounds of extra support for individuals and couples.

If you have been turned down for Pension Credit, but are eligible for other benefits and are worried about the cost of heating your home, you can sign up for Thurrock's Pensioner Winter Support Fund. We have set aside £100,000 from our Government's Household Support Fund allocation, to help older residents who are struggling to heat their homes.

If you need help, apply today for a one-off support payment, through the Essential Living Fund.

Warm Spaces

Warm Spaces are safe, welcoming places where you can spend time to stay warm, meet others, and get information and advice on keeping well through the winter.

All of our libraries are hosting Warm Spaces during their opening hours where you can have a space to stay or study and access free Wi-Fi and computers. Jigsaws and board games, plus classes and activities are available at some libraries.

Many of our Sheltered Housing sites are offering Warm Spaces for their residents and members of the public during the colder months. Free hot drinks will be available and you can also take part in an Oomph! activity session (optional) to help keep you active and make new friends. If you have flu or cold symptoms, or feel unwell, please do not attend these Warm Spaces to help us keep our Sheltered Housing residents safe.

HELP FOR HOMEOWNERS & PRIVATE TENANTS WITH REPAIRS AND ENERGY EFFICIENCY

Well Homes

Thurrock Well Homes is a scheme to improve the housing conditions and the health and well-being of residents living in private properties.

The Well Homes scheme:

- · help to make homes safer by reducing the risk of ill health or accidents
- puts residents in touch with health and lifestyle services that can improve quality of life for example, help to stop smoking, free health checks, healthier drinking habits, weight management, vaccinations, adaptations, social groups, family support making life easier with more independence

Advice can be given on:

- · keeping your home warm, dry and well maintained
- fire safety/free smoke detectors
- · help with heating repairs, loft and cavity insulation
- · help to carry out repairs/insulate for home owners
- help to deal with your landlord if you are a private tenant if they are carrying out repairs
- health and lifestyle services listed above
