Tasks and responsibilities

You will be expected to:

- support the EAC Manager to establish and maintain continual communications between the EAC and the Thurrock Emergency Control Centre (TECC)
- support the EAC Manager to continually inform the EAC evacuees and staff of the current incident

Skills and experience

You must:

- be able to communicate effectively with people of different ages, physical and psychological needs and varying backgrounds who are faced with a difficult and stressful situation

Experience within a form of communications is desirable.

Time commitment

As emergency incidents are not frequent, it will be an 'as and when' role. It could be during the day, at the weekend or during the night, whenever there is an emergency.
