## Youth Offending reparation supervisor

<b>Supported by</b>	Youth Offending Team Referral Order Co-ordinator
<b>Role summary</b>	Holding meetings with young people and their families to discuss the reasons behind their offending. The aim of the meetings is to put together a contract designed to prevent the young person from reoffending.

### Tasks and responsibilities

You will be expected to:

- volunteer face-to-face with young people and their families
- assist professionals in planning a range of activities aimed at preventing young people from committing offences and making positive changes within their lives
- chair restorative-based meetings designed to integrate young offenders back into the local community with a focus on the victims of the crime
- act in an anti-discriminatory way in all aspects of this role
- participate in informal supervision and training relevant to the role and assist in identifying own training and development needs
- comply with the Health and Safety Act 1974 and all other requirements of council policy and the team's local guidance – all information will be given
- support any other activities that may be reasonably required from time to time in keeping with the nature of the volunteer role

### Skills and experience

You must:

- have excellent communication skills
- be reliable and have commitment
- have empathy with young people
- be able to maintain confidentiality

### Time commitment

3 hours, usually on Wednesday evenings, on a rota.
